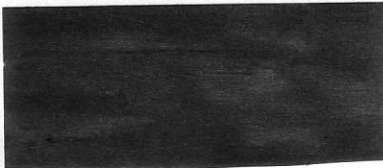



Dear Mr Lewis

Thank you for writing to us about the above Penalty Charge Notice (PCN).

I have carefully considered what you say and all the available evidence, but I do not agree that we should cancel your liability for this PCN.

This PCN was issued because the vehicle was seen parked on a waiting restriction marked by a yellow line.

Your vehicle was in controlled parking zone CC. Restrictions in that zone apply from 09:00 to 20:00, Monday to Sunday. There are signs at the entrances to the zone that show the controlled hours. *Single yellow lines within the zone apply during the same hours as the zone, unless they have a separate sign showing different times.*

The civil enforcement officers notes clearly state that your vehicle was parked in contravention outside number 1 Rockley road. You have stated that you parked opposite a sign that advised a parking restriction from Mon-sat 8am-6:30pm. The sign you have referred to is applicable to the adjacent yellow line only and does not apply to the single yellow line outside number 1 Rockley road.

The PCN was issued on 29/12/2008 at 18:39, on a single yellow line which applied until 20:00. During a period of 6 minutes no activity was seen at the vehicle. Drivers have the responsibility of checking restriction signs and markings, and must park in accordance with them.

I am therefore satisfied that the PCN was properly given within the law.

referred to adjacent to the yellow line across the road from where your vehicle was parked and a distinct absence of a time plate where your vehicle was parked in contravention.

If you wish to pay at the discounted rate of £60, you may still do so, provided we receive your £60 payment within 14 days of the date of this letter. **THIS OFFER WILL NOT BE REPEATED.** Once these 14 days have expired, the full charge of £120 will become due.

How to pay:

1. By cheque or postal order

Please:

- cross your cheque or postal order 'a/c payee';
- make it payable to 'LBHF';
- write your registration number and PCN number on the back; and
- send it to us at the above address.

DO NOT SEND CASH BY POST

2. By MASTERCARD, VISA CREDIT, VISA DEBIT, SOLO, or MAESTRO

You can pay:

- either via the internet at www.lbhf.gov.uk, or;
- by calling us on (020) 7371 5678. We have an automated payment system that you can use at any time (except for routine maintenance hours of 6pm to 7pm, Monday to Friday). Assistance with card payments is available during our office hours of 8am to 6pm, Monday to Saturday (except public holidays). Please note that all telephone calls to the Parking Services Office are recorded.

3. In person

- at the Cashiers office on the 1st floor of Hammersmith Town Hall Extension, King Street, W6. They are open from 8:45am to 5pm, Monday to Friday (except public holidays). They accept cash, cheques, postal orders, and the credit/debit cards listed above.


How to take the case further: (if you believe you were legally parked)

1 If you do not pay, we will send a 'Notice to Owner' to the keeper. This form offers the keeper the chance to formally challenge the PCN, or to pay the full charge (by this time it will be too late to take advantage of the discount). If you are not the registered keeper, let them know what you decide to do.

2 If we still disagree with you, the keeper can take the case to the Adjudication Service. The Adjudicator is independent and his or her decision is binding on both sides.
